**Thinking Outside the Food Basket

- A donation to Heifer International's Ram Exchange Program on the Navajo Indian reservation in Northern Arizona. The program helps provide rams to revitalize the reservation's all-important, yet deteriorating, sheep industry. The rams were used to repopulate their herds, which produce wool for the tribe. AAM clients received a small stuffed ram symbolizing the donation
- A contribution to the Arizona Animal Welfare League. Clients received a pet-themed picture frame with a photo of either a dog or cat from the shelter.
